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Marion Christian Church has entered a new day in our story. We are not the same church we were before the pandemic and 2020 derecho. **There are exciting things happening!** It is important that we continue to pay close attention to the Holy Spirit's guidance and assess the ministries we are doing and programs we are offering. In so doing, Carrie Hendricks, Pastor Gary and Pastor Tammy have been visiting with participants, listening to feedback, as we strive to offer effective, relevant faith education to all ages.

With that said, we are going to try a few different things with our <u>Sunday morning education</u> <u>schedule starting November 26.</u>

Starting November 26, there will <u>not</u> be 9 a.m. educational experiences. <u>Instead</u>, we are excited to announce some important changes and new offerings...

- the Children's educational experience (pre-school through 5<sup>th</sup> grade) will occur <u>during the 10 a.m. worship service</u>. This will bolster the experience for these ages. The children will start in worship with their families and depart to their classes after the children's moment. The teachers that have been serving at 9 a.m. will shift to alternate and cover this new time slot. Teachers and parents are on board with this shift.
- The **adult class** that has been offered at 9 a.m. will pause at this time. After the first of the year we will identify the best placement of an adult study: perhaps that is Sunday mornings following worship or on a weekday or Wednesday evening during Oasis.

# Also, starting November 26, we will offer an educational / interactive experience for <u>ALL</u> ages <u>immediately following worship in the Fellowship Hall</u> (at approximately 11:11 a.m.)

**Nov 26** - (Thanksgiving weekend) – Advent Workshop for all ages (supplies to make Chrismons for the Chrismon tree in the sanctuary and advent wreath kits for individuals / families to take home)

**Dec 3** – 1<sup>st</sup> Advent - Hanging of the Greens during the worship service – Advent Workshop **Dec 10** –  $2^{nd}$  Advent - <u>Christmas Program</u> during the worship service - reception to follow with hot chocolate bar for all ages

Dec 17 – 3<sup>rd</sup> Advent - Christmas and Epiphany workshop

Dec 24 – 4<sup>th</sup> Advent in the 10 am service - no programs following worship

Dec 31 - 10 am worship - no programs following worship

**Happy New Year! January 2024** – continue pre-school through 5<sup>th</sup> grade education program during 10 a.m. worship (children will start in worship with their families and depart to their classes following the Children's Moment)

Please make plans to join us for these wonderful opportunities! Also, stay tuned for more details about special events and schedule changes for December.

# FILLING THE CHALICE

As we prepare to call a new full-time settled pastor, it is very important to welcome our new pastor with strong financial support for the total ministry of MCC which is represented in our annual ministry budget. To fully support the 2024 MCC ministry budget, we need financial gifts totaling \$296,701.00. Together, our gifts of \$296,701 in 2024 will fully support

- the ministry of our new pastor and other dedicated MCC staff members (office, music, and director of family ministries) – \$ 197,597.00;
- world and local missions (10% of our total giving);
- our church building and all of the ministry that takes place in it (worship, fellowship, Christian Education, Oasis, First Light Christian Fellowship, community meetings/events, etc.)—\$74,604.00.

Now, while \$296,701 may seem like a rather large number, it is an achievable goal for a congregation of our size if we all work together. Currently, we have anticipated giving of \$245,000 from 79 MCC giving units (pledgers and regular givers) averaging \$3101/giving unit. To achieve our goal of \$296,701 and fully support our 2024 ministry budget, we need an increased giving of \$51,701, and this is where we all need to work together! Some of us may be able to increase our weekly, monthly, or annual giving. For those of us who have been giving to the Capital Campaign over the past three years, we might want to add that money to our annual budget giving once those pledges expire at the end of this year. Others may look at their current level of giving and decide that they are able to take a step-up in their regular giving. Please send an email message to our Financial Secretary Patty Wise (pwise@ncsei.com) or fill out another pledge card to indicate your desire to increase your giving. Some who are not currently giving regularly may decide that now is the time to join other MCC members/partic-

ipants in financially supporting our church. Pledge cards are available on the table at the back of the sanctuary and can be placed in the pledge box there or in an offering plate.

Some are giving as much as they are able. Every gift is important; every gift makes a difference and is appreciated.

You will see a graphic of our Disciples of Christ chalice in the church building and in various church communications illustrating where we are in achieving our 2024 Ministry Budget goal. Let's all work together to fill the chalice so that we can welcome our new minister with a ministry budget that is fully supported! Pastor Gary

MCC Council Meeting

## Marion Christian Church Council Hybrid Meeting Provisional Minutes Sunday, October 15, 2023 11:30am

**PRESENT:** Ryan Wilcox, Gary Sneller, Kari Wilcox, Joyce Talley, April Evers, Tammy Buseman, Jill Law, Sharon McIntosh, Dean Decious, Gloria Waltke, Nikki Kibler, Tim Feldmann, Justin Lightfoot, Becky Clemens, Marilyn Rambo, Erin Wittkowski, Krystal Monawar, Mike Kibler, Susan Boatwright, Darrell Boatwright, Sue Thompson, Patty Wise **The meeting was opened with prayer by Chair Becky Clemens.** She announced that the Co-Interim Minister reports and New Business items would be addressed first.

#### CO-INTERIM MINISTERS' REPORT – Gary Sneller and Tammy Cameron Buseman

Gary reported that they had reached the 6-month point in their interim ministry and they had been working on creating a solid foundation for the church. Phase two is to focus on preparing for our next settled senior minister. Tammy continued that the focus includes realizing that we are not the church we were pre-pandemic. Although our attendance is around 100 now, in contrast to the 200+ before, indications are that we are meeting our needs, we have visitors, and the budget hasn't gone down. Much time and talent was used to get us back into ministry with our completed Christian Education wing, and we need to concentrate on moving forward with that. Our greatest concern is that the 2024 proposed budget is ridiculously lean in the areas of ministry. Marion Christian Church members are heading in the right direction, but some tweaking and pivoting to collectively approach the shortfall needs to be addressed. We need to build on our leadership potential and invite and nurture others into ministries. We also need to strengthen our giving and invite others to do so as the excitement for our future continues.

#### **NEW BUSINESS:**

2024 Nominating Slate - Justin Lightfoot presented the proposed slate of officers with a few additions (attached). He also presented a motion to amend the Bylaws wording to allow Deacons AND Elders the ability to also hold an appointed position. (Section III: Officers, both Elected and Appointed, under Paragraph B, the last sentence currently reads: "Deacons are eligible for appointment to any of these positions." The change would read: "Elders and Deacons are eligible for appointment to any of these positions.") Mike Kibler seconded the motion.

Approved. Justin then moved for the slate to be approved and Krystal Monawar seconded. Approved.

- Pastoral Search Update Becky Clemens reported that the Search Team is looking seriously at one candidate, and if the search continues positively, a settled minister might be in position early in 2024.
- 2024 Budget Erin Wittkowski presented the Proposed 2024 Budget, indicating areas where cuts were necessary. Patty Wise indicated that some shortfall in the giving is due to older members passing away. She also explained that the PPP funds are not available for the 2024 expenses because they are being saved for a settled minister's travel/moving expenses. Erin explained that, at this point in 2023, if we DID have a settled minister, we would have a \$22,000 deficit given our current giving. Our 2024 pledges are 96% of our 2023 pledges at this point, which would give us a potential deficit of \$51,000 at the end of 2024 with a settled minister.

The Council had an extensive discussion on how to build awareness and invite additional giving among the congregation.

Mention was also made that any people who personally donate supplies need to somehow record the monetary amounts so they can be included in budget totals to give a clearer picture of what expenses would actually be if they hadn't donated them.

Mike Kibler moved and Jill Law seconded to approve the Proposed 2024 budget. Approved.

Becky tabled addressing STANDING BUSI-NESS items and the Building Update until the next regular Council meeting. (The Ministry Team reports appear below.)

Scout Trailer transaction completed, MCC received \$500 for trailer. The trailer has been removed from MCC Property Tom has solicited an estimate for replacement of asphalt for our lot from Pate Asphalt, also an overlay estimate which they do not recommend given the condition of our current asphalt. (Remove & Replace \$174,330.00; Overlay \$129,816.00) Mike would like to see additional competing bids for the work, but does agree that a full removal with inspection of the underlying material and full depth replacement is the better, longer lasting option.

Informal discussion on whether or not to sell off the church van has begun. It was mentioned in the budgetary meeting and also during informal discussion with Gary. This would likely need to be discussed by the entire Council. The van costs us around \$800 each year just to insure and register it. Any routine maintenance not donated by a mechanic would be extra; it is, or nearly is, 20 years old and does not get much use. Tom has made an open query to see if anyone has ideas for options to either make the communion table easier to move for special events, or to have it replaced.

#### INREACH: Congregational Care and Evangelism – Elder Sharon McIntosh; Deacons April Evers & Jill Law

The Congregational Care & Evangelism team has started to put up photos on the Photo Board in the Narthex. Please provide your photos!

Fellowship time is going very well since Sunday school has started. All Sundays are filled with helpers thru December, which Congregational Care has picked up for December 24th & 31st.

#### OUTREACH: World & Local Missions – Elders Sue Boatwright & Cathy Fuller; Deacon Gloria Waltke

 We wrapped up the final warehouse sale with left over items given away with a donation of cash or non-perishable items to the Marion Food Pantry. We donated 5 boxes of food and about \$290. Items left went to the Willis Dady Shelter, Salvation Army, His Hands Free Clinic, and recycling.
 Marion Cares has advised us of items needed for their Trunk or Treat. This is handled by us adopting a child and purchasing winter coats, boots, etc. as requested. We have adopted seven students as of this writing. After purchasing, we will determine if we can adopt more based on our budget. 3. We now have a contact system in place to touch base and/or take communion to some of our homebound. Some will receive person contacts, others just a phone call. We coordinated this with Rev. Sneller.

4. We are in discussion with Gary and Tammy regarding families who might be in need of assistance for food for the holidays. Once those are determined, we will be contacting them as to their needs.

5. We will be having a discussion regarding our budget this week and determine the agencies to which we can send some money. This is the time of year when many of their finances get stretched thinner by requests.

#### OUTREACH: Community Growth & Formation – Elders Gary Sneller & Kiley Harris; Deacons Deanna Long & Krystal Monawar

Here is the final budget accounting for the Community Open House/180th Anniversary celebration weekend:

**Budgeted money:** \$650--Community Growth and Formation (including \$180 from encumbered fund for Special Events); \$450--Pat Burnett memorial fund; \$200--Congregational Care; \$295--net from t-shirt sales = \$1595.00

**Expenses:** \$250--face painting; \$150--balloon animals; \$187.50 (half price)--bouncy obstacle course; \$212.69-meal (meat, buns, sauce); \$621--Jim Warren (preaching honorarium, mileage, lodging) = \$1421.19

This leaves us with a balance of \$173.81 for the Special Events fund.

#### OLD BUSINESS: Building Update – Darrell Boatwright
